THE LOVE OF MONEY

The Bible warns about loving money. “But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For **the love of money** is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows” (I Timothy 6:9-10). Notice that it is not money, but the “love of money” that is the root of all evil. Money is not inherently bad or sinful, but it is often our attitude toward money that is wrong. When we “love” money, we are setting ourselves up for a fall.

People love money because it creates an illusion of security. Money has the power to purchase a lot of things, and these things may cause us to feel secure. However, Jesus warned about the “deceitfulness of riches” (Matthew 13:22). The truth is, there is no real security in money. The wealthy die with cancer, have heart attacks, divorce, have rebellious children, worry, take anti-depressants, and commit suicide just as those who are not wealthy. Money, therefore, does not and cannot solve some of man’s greatest problems. Scripture warns: “He that trusteth in his riches shall fall; but the righteous shall flourish as a branch” (Proverbs 11:28). Rather than offering security, money may bring temptations, become a snare, and may cause one to fall into many foolish and hurtful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition (I Timothy 6:9). Is it any wonder Jesus taught that it is hard for a rich man to go to heaven (Matthew 19:23)? One who has a lot of money will get a lot of attention from the devil. The ironic thing about all this is that most do not think they have an unreasonable love of money. Yet, when we are totally honest with ourselves, the decisions we sometimes make indicate that we love money and material things. We sometimes neglect the most important things in life because we are obsessed with the “almighty dollar.” Jesus said, “No man can serve two masters...Ye cannot serve God and money” (Matthew 6:24).
