WHO HAS THE RIGHT TO MARRY? Mark Lindley

Marriage is one of life's greatest blessings. Although our present culture does not value marriage, no other earthly relationship is as fulfilling as the marital relationship.

However, according to the Bible, not everyone has the right to marry. There are three classes of people who can marry, with God's approval.

1. Those who have never married may marry an eligible partner. Paul affirmed that if one who has never married chooses to marry, he or she has "not sinned" (I Cor.7:28). We are created as sexual beings, and the Bible teaches that to "avoid fornication," a man should marry a woman, and a woman should marry a man (I Cor.7:2-3).

Also, marriage provides companionship. When God created Adam, God saw that it was "not good" for him to be alone (Gen.2:18). Therefore, God created Eve who would be Adam's helper and companion.

Another purpose of marriage is that children may be born within that sacred relationship. It is God's will that children be born to couples who are mature enough to be parents and who will love their children unconditionally (Gen.1:28; I Tim.5:14; Tit.2:4).

2. Those whose spouses have died may marry an eligible marriage partner. The Bible makes it clear that the marriage bond continues until death: "For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to her husband so long as he liveth; but if the husband be dead, she is loosed from the law of her husband. So then if, while her husband liveth, she be married to another man, she shall be called an adulteress: but if her husband be dead, she is no adulteress, though she be married to another man" (Rom.7:2-3). Some, whose spouses die, choose to remarry. Others choose to remain unmarried. Those who choose to remarry must choose an "eligible marriage partner" (cf. I Cor.7:39).

3. Those who have put their spouses away for the sin of fornication may remarry. Jesus said, "Whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultery: and whoso marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery" (Matt.19:9). It is clear from this passage, that the innocent party may divorce the guilty party (adulterer) and remarry with God's approval. However, the guilty party may not remarry. One who has been put away for fornication has no biblical right to remarry. To marry the one put away is to commit "adultery" (Matt.19:9b).

Yes, marriage is a wonderful blessing. However, not everyone man or woman is eligible to marry. If you are married, nurture your relationship and cherish your partner God has provided!

Galatians 6:10 says, "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good to all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith." One of the things God has clearly set forth is for His people to help the needy, especially His people.

The tornadoes, one-half (1/2) mile wide and twenty-one (21) miles long, which came through the Oak Grove and Birmingham area, found Christians far and wide giving of their time and money to lend a helping hand to those affected. Many have helped as or according to their opportunity. (Galatians 6:10). One church in Missouri sent \$ 25,000 at the suggestion of a Christian lady.

Our elders are to be commended for sending this money to help those who lost so much. "Whose faith follow considering the end of their conversation" (manner of life) (Hebrews 13:7, 17) is more than words in the scriptures. Their actions show that they are not covetous (Hebrews 13:5), and that they take the word of God seriously. By the way, the elders are going to aid in the Ukraine work, which has resulted in many baptisms already, according to Mark Posey, faithful gospel preacher who has done much work there. Several from area churches have given a number of hours to assembling boxes for this work. These things and others show that we know that a part of our work is to evangelize and be benevolent, not to store and/or hoard our funds. Tell the elders how thankful you are for their leadership. Don't just take for granted that they know it.

Let us not forget to pray for success. Let us thank God for our blessings, and the opportunities to help others. Let us also pray that those on the receiving end will use what is given to the glory of God. (Matthew5:16). "Peter and John went together into the temple at the hour of prayer,..." (Acts 3:1). How soon after the events of Acts 2? We are not told, but it appears shortly. Prayer was an important part of their lives. (Acts 2:41, 42). Prayer ought to be as much a part of our lives as it was the Psalmist David's. He said, "Give ear to my prayer, O God; and hide not thyself from my supplication...As for me, I will call upon God; and the Lord shall save me.

Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice." (Psalms 55:1,16, 17; 5:2; 32:6; and many more).
